25.5	Strawberry Fields/ 106 Agreement update	
25.5.a	Last email to David Jones ,Team Leader, Planning & Sustainable Development – East	Noted
	was sent 6 <sup>th</sup> May. So far we are in a 'holding pattern' awaiting a definitive answer	
	from the Chief Exec. The email reiterated lack of response from LCC. Also raised was	
	the lack of control in regard the asbestos removal from the site on the part of LCC	
	accompanied by the dismissive response from the Planning case officer. There is	



	also the matter of a missing Construction Plan from the developer which is meant to	
	be in place prior to commencement of work on site. Further response awaited.	
25.5b	106 Agreement	SG
	SG gave feedback on his work to bring together all the interested parties who have	
	input to the section 106 agreement. These are planners, the West Yorkshire	
	Combined Authority, the developers and lawyers. SG explained that each of these	
	parties has a very narrow remit and that none of them has overall responsibility to	
	ensure that the outcome is equitable and acceptable to the Carlton community. SG	
	has established by talking to the Council's legal officers that it would cost about	
	£10,000 in legal fees (overall total for the Council lawyers (approx £6k) and the	
	developer's lawyers (approx £4K)) to get a 106a agreement drawn up. Obviously the	
	developer has no interest in spending this amount for no benefit (they would still be	
	paying £1million). SG is exploring whether the Council could provide this £10,000 so	
	that the developer would have no cost to get a 106a agreement. i.e. invest £10,000	
	to get £1million invested in the right place.	
25.5.c	Construction	Noted
	Although no Construction Statement has been forthcoming from Avant/ BdeV,	
	demolition of the sheds and work on outbuildings has started with one operator on	
	site saying they have five weeks to complete demolition.	
	They have been starting at 07.30h which contravenes the Inspectors conditions.	
	A representative of Avant Homes has been in touch with KG &CG in regard to	
	boundary walls. He advised this initial stage is removing the soil to eradicate harmful	
	weeds, giant hogweed and Himalayan balsam. Environmental study done and the opposite side of the field has ground-nesting birds are there. Apparently none in the	
	sheds, but they will have to have them checked again before demolition, at least a	
	month away. Contact email provided.
